Honoring Retired Women Religious

Catholic Sisters have played a vital role in shaping life in the United States. Sisters established the Nation's largest private school system and founded more than 110 colleges and universities, educating millions of young people in the United States. They participated in the opening of the West traveling vast distances to minister in remote locations, setting up schools and hospitals, and working among native populations on distant reservations; they nursed both Union and Confederate soldiers alike during the Civil War, epidemics of cholera, typhoid, yellow fever, smallpox, tuberculosis. Sisters built and established hospitals, orphanages, and charitable institutions that have served millions of people. Catholic sisters continue to this day to provide shelter, food, and basic human needs to the economically or socially disadvantaged and advocate relentlessly for the fair and equal treatment of all persons. They work for the eradication of poverty and racism and for the promotion of nonviolence, equality, and democracy in principle and in action. The U.S.A House of Representatives honors and commends Catholic sisters for their humble service and courageous sacrifice throughout the history of this Nation.
